USGA RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY UNLESS MODIFIED BY LOCAL RULES:

Abnormal Ground Conditions (Rule 25): Is any casual water, ground under repair or hole, cast or runway on the course made by a burrowing animal, a reptile or bird (definition). Also, any construction area, newly sodded or seeded area and any damage caused by maintenance vehicles or golf cars is considered to be ground under repair. Left side of Oak Glen #12: NO relief from the concrete/dirt area directly beneath the boundary.

Note: (1) Ground under repair is identified by white lines. (2) Relief procedure; Rule 25-1b; 25-1c.

Out of Bounds: Willow Course: Defined by inside points, at ground level of property line fences, white stakes and the maintenance area left of #2 fairway. **Oak Glen:** Defined by inside points, at ground level of property line fences, white stakes, retaining wall (left side of #10), and roof line of the maintenance building right side of #10 and #18. A ball coming to rest beyond the wall or curbing behind #1 and #10 Tees, and #9 and #18 Greens is deemed to be out of bounds.

Car Paths and Roads: All paved and dirt car paths, extensions of car paths, and maintenance roads are obstructions; Rule 24-2.

Concrete Drainage Ditches: Are considered immovable obstructions; Rule 24.

Planted Beds: Identified by orange stakes. Play prohibited – Relief: play as ground under repair; Rule 25.

Rest Rooms, Snack Bars, Pump Houses, and Well Structures: Are considered immovable obstructions; Rule 24. Stance and swing relief. No line of play relief.

Power Lines: Any ball striking any power line, power pole or support which is in bounds MUST be replayed.

Protection of Young Trees: Protection of young trees identified by stakes attached to them. If such a tree interferes with a player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the ball must be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b (Immovable Obstruction), App 1-B-3.

Tree Wells/Basins: The area directly under young trees (identified with stakes and supporting wires) that has been artificially created to form a basin to collect water has been deemed an immovable obstruction and players may proceed under Rule 24-2b (Immovable Obstruction).

Fallen or Cut Trees / Tree Limbs not growing or attached: Play as ground under repair.

Storm Damage: Accumulated debris, mud/soil, wash outs, damaged turf and associated repair work, materials and equipment are deemed to be ground under repair or obstructions as appropriate.

Double Green on Oak Glen #2 and #16 and Willow Glen #4: If your ball is on either putting green of the total putting surface, you should use your putter. If you take relief from this green you must proceed under Rule 28.

Fans on Willow #2: The large fans on Willow Glen #2 are considered temporary immovable obstructions and players are entitled to relief if a TIO interferes with player's stance or swing or intervenes directly between the player's ball and the hole and is in his line of play; Relief Rule 24-2a, 24-2b, App. 1-B-7.

Embedded Ball: A ball that is embedded in its own pitch-mark, through the green, may be lifted, cleaned, and dropped as near as possible to the spot where it became embedded no closer to the hole. Rule 25-2.

Sprinkler heads on the apron near putting greens: If a sprinkler head lies within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief under Rule 24-2 (Immovable Obstruction), App. 1-B-6
